
Organizing Desktop & Start Menu Shortcuts ...


Like some of you I had a lot of untidy **Shortcut Icons** on the **Desktop** plus using the **Start Menu** to run different applications which could involve quite a few steps and decided to do something about it so programs I needed easy access are only 2/3 **Clicks** away and does not require any searching.

The Image below shows an example part of my **Start Menu** in **Windows 10 PC** which I use when hosting **NVM's Computer Group**. As can be seen some of the **CyberLink** programs are easily accessed while others require Folder browsing to run them.

(image shown below left and below). The first **3 Taskbar Toolbars** require **2 Clicks** to launch any program within while the **Shortcuts Toolbar** requires **3 clicks**.






the **NVM PC Group** use SWINDOWS.~BT different versions of Pow-CyberLink erDirector and they all co -exist in Windows 10. Favorites GvTemp The Reason for the Shortcuts Toolbar was to Intel make more room on the Links Taskbar by moving the previous 3 red bordered Logs Folders inside it (see im-PerfLogs age at right) and later de-Program Files leting them as they were no longer needed making Program Files (x86) more room on the Taskbar. ProgramData By having just the one Shortcuts 🛨 Shortcuts Toolbar makes System the **Taskbar** less crowded. Quite a few more Toolbar Tool_Kit_USB categories can be added to Users it for easy 3 Click access instead of browsing the Windows

My solution was first to make some **Folders** in **Windows 10** drive **'C'** named **CyberLink**, **System**, **Tools** and later added a **Shortcuts Toolbar** on the **Taskbar**

Start Menu.



To create a **Taskbar Toolbar**, **Right-Click** on the **Taskbar** then **New Toolbar**. (see image at top) and browse to the location where the created **Folders** are and select it. Image at top is for **Windows 8** on another **PC** while image bottom left is for **Windows 10**.


After making main Folder and Sub Folders on Drive 'C' or any other permanent drive, simply copy the Desktop and/or Start Menu Shortcuts to the created Folder categories as I have done. Some Windows 8/10 Shortcuts can be copied between PCs. JPL


